

The church that Jesus is building is not denominational. It is not built on man's doctrine but is built upon the revelation of who Jesus is. That He is the Christ (Messiah), the Son of the Living God (God in the flesh). Are you a part of the church that Jesus is building? His church is victorious in the earth - not even the gates of hell can stop it.

Jesus is the One who is building His church
Matthew 16:18, "Simon Peter answered and said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus answered and said to him, "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah, for flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but My Father who is in heaven. And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it."

To call Jesus the Son of God does not mean that God had a baby but that God became a man and dwelt among us. Jesus is God!
John 8:58, "Jesus said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM."

Jesus is God manifested in the flesh
1 Timothy 3:16, "And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifested in the flesh....."
Matthew 1:23, "Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "God with us."

Not everyone who says, 'Lord, Lord' shall enter the Kingdom of Heaven

Matthew 7:21-23, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, **but he who does the will of My Father in heaven.** Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name? And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!'"

What is the will of the Father?

John 6:40, "And this is the will of Him who sent Me, **that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have everlasting life; and I will raise him up at the last day.**"

The will of the Father is for us to see (have revelation knowledge) and believe in the Son of God. This is how we enter into a relationship with the living God - this is eternal life (1 John 5:20).

All our good works (even that are done in Jesus' name) cannot give us eternal life and entry into the Kingdom of God.

- Are you doing the will of your Father in heaven?
- Have your eyes been opened to see the Son of God?
- Are you believing in Him - that He is God in the flesh?
- Are you walking in obedience to Jesus?

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You cannot separate the Son from the Father. They are not separate persons but they are one. The revelation of the Father is only found in Jesus.

John 10:30, "I and My Father are one"
the Father, so how can you say, 'Show us the Father'?

John 14:9, "Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father, so how can you say, 'Show us the Father'?"

1 John 2:23, "Whoever denies the Son does not have the Father either; he who acknowledges the Son has the Father also."

If you have the Son, you have the Father also. We can only know the Father through the Son.

The old and new testament Scriptures testify of Jesus. Jesus has come and fulfilled the Scriptures. He is the Word of God made flesh (John 1:14)

John 5:39, 46, "You search the Scriptures, for in them you think you have eternal life; and these are they which testify of Me"
"For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me; for he wrote about Me."

All of the Scriptures testify of Jesus

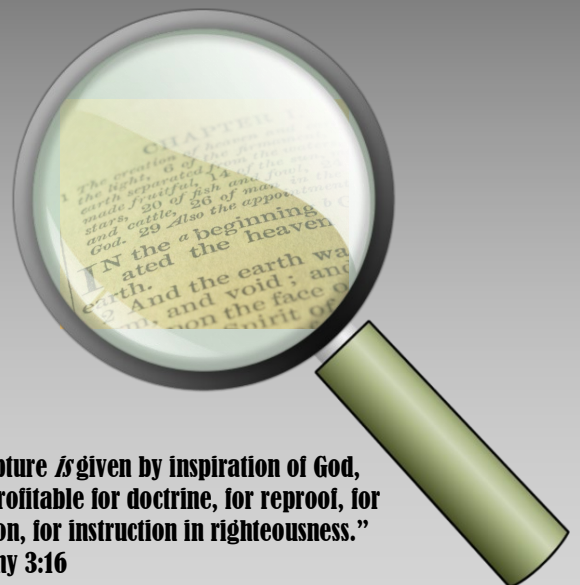
We cannot come to God through any man, 'Saint' or spirit. It is only through the Man Christ Jesus.
