

Question 3. ***“Do you know Jesus Christ is in you?”***

2 Corinthians 13:5, ***“Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?”***

Finally, once we have believed and received Jesus we now need to know Jesus Christ in us.

Christ now dwells in our hearts through faith (Ephesians 3:17). Christ is to be formed in you now (Galatians 4:19). He is Christ in you the hope of glory (Colossians 1:27)

The Call to follow Jesus involves us being able to answer all these questions and enter into the reality of each one.

The Most important Questions in the Bible



These Questions help to bring us into the:

- *Revelation of Jesus Christ
- *The Foundations of our Faith
- *The experience of being Filled with the Holy Spirit
- *And the Reality of knowing Christ in us

Question 2. *“What shall we do?”*

Acts 2:37, Now when they heard the preaching of Christ, they were cut to the heart, and said.... ***“What shall we do?”*** When we receive the revelation of who Jesus the Christ is we must ask ourselves this next question, ***“What shall I do?”*** Acts 2 :38, tells us Peter’s response to this question. ***“Then Peter said to them, Repent and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.”***

1. We need to repent. Repent means to change your mind on what you have believed about God and to put your faith in Jesus. ***Have you repented?***

2. Be Baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. We need to be fully immersed in His death, burial and resurrection (Romans 6:3-5). We are baptised for the remission (sending away) of our sins. No longer a slave to sin (Romans 6:6). ***Have you been baptised into Jesus Christ?***

3. Receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. In Acts 19:2, when the apostle Paul found some believers in Jesus, he asked them, ***“Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed.”*** We need the Holy Spirit. We are to ask our heavenly Father for the Holy Spirit (Luke 11:13)

Question 1. *Who do you say that I am?”*

Matthew 16:15, “Jesus said to them ***“Who do you say that I am?”*** We need to all honestly ask ourselves this question, ‘who do you say Jesus is?’ The Scriptures all testify of who Jesus is (Luke 24:27)

In Matthew 16:16, ***“Simon Peter answered and said , “You are the Christ the Son of the Living God.”***

The two main revelations we need of who Jesus is:

1. THE CHRIST – The anointed King/Messiah who was spoken of throughout all the Scriptures. Jesus fulfilled all that was written of Him. Roman 9:5, ***“Whom, according to the flesh, Christ came, who is over all, the eternally blessed God. Amen.”***

2. THE SON OF THE LIVING GOD – That is God was manifested in the flesh (1 Timothy 3:16)

The Son of God is called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6)
