LABOURERS SENT INTO THE HARVEST

Luke 10:1-20

Jesus sent out 'seventy others' Luke 10:1

- **Appointed by the Lord** it is important to know that we have been 'appointed'.
- <u>Sent</u> two by two 35 teams going out!
 They were not going alone.

The word 'sent' is the Greek word 'apostello' – this was an apostolic sending.

- Into every place where "He Himself was about to go" – Jesus was going with them.
- They were preparing the way for Jesus to come.

There is a great harvest

v.2 "The harvest truly is great, but the <u>labourers</u> are few; therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to <u>send</u> out labourers into His harvest".

'labourers' = teachers, ones who have been discipled and trained.

 The ones sent out had been properly discipled and trained, so they knew what to teach.

- There is a great harvest
- Pray for more labourers to be sent out into the harvest
- It is 'His harvest' we are working with Him, in His harvest.

Matthew also records these exact same words of Jesus in **Matthew 9:37-38**.

- The word for 'send' is the Greek word 'ekballo' meaning: to eject & is also translated as 'cast out'.
- Are you ready to be 'thrust out' into the harvest?

Jesus answered His own prayer

- In Matthew 10 by sending out the twelve apostles
- In **Luke 10** by sending out 'seventy others'.

Jesus gives instructions to those He sends out into the harvest

v.3 Sent out as "lambs among wolves"

- There will be opposition.
- The opposition can come from men: religious leaders, man's traditions, or it can be demonic.
- Jesus told the ones he sent out in Matthew 10:16 "be wise as serpents and harmless as doves".

v.4 Jesus wants them to trust Him for everything, even their provision.

- If we know we are doing God's will, we can trust Him to provide all we need.
- "Greet no one along the road" this is an instruction to stay focused on the task.
 [2 Kings 4:29]

v.5-6 Jesus instructed them to find a house where they would be received – 'a house of peace'.

- the 'peace of God' is the sign that you are in a place where you are received.
- Do not remain in a place where there is no peace.
- Jesus commanded ministry in and from the house.

v.7 In a house of peace, there will be provision.

"the labourer is worthy of his wages"
 the one who gives spiritual food, can expect to be taken care of materially.

 [1 Timothy 5:17-18]

v.8 Jesus emphasises the importance of being 'received'.

We are to receive and look after the ones God sends to us.

v.9 "Heal the sick ... and say ... the kingdom of God has come near to you"

- Healing the sick is a sign that the kingdom of God has come!
- Jesus gave the same instructions to the twelve apostles sent out in Luke 9:2: "He sent them to preach the kingdom of God and to heal the sick".

➤ Healing the sick can open people up to receive the kingdom of God, and it is a major aspect of the 'good news' of the kingdom!

There will be those who do not receive v.10 Jesus' instructions were to go and preach "the kingdom of God".

- If people do not receive the message preached Jesus says: "know this, that the kingdom of God has come near you" v.11.
- We are to be faithful to obey Jesus but know that not everyone will receive the message.

Jesus is the one who is being rejected

- "He who hears you hears Me, and he who rejects you rejects Me, and He who rejects Me rejects Him who sent Me" v.16.
- Jesus warned the ones He sent out in Matthew 10:16-23 that they must be prepared to face persecution & opposition.

The ones sent out 'reported back'

v.17 The ones sent "returned with joy"

- They reported to Jesus what had happened.
- Being accountable & reporting back is an important part of being 'sent'

Acts 14:26 – Paul & Barnabas
 "reported all that God had done" to
 those who had sent them.

The ones sent had experienced the power of God working through them

- They had recognised the power of the 'Name of Jesus'
- "even demons are subject to us in Your name".

Jesus knew His authority over the devil v.18 Jesus said, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven"

- This is not a reference to Satan's original rebellion against God
- Jesus was saying that when He sent the 70 out with His authority and power, Satan's power was overcome!
- Principalities and powers in the heavenlies are overcome by the workers that are sent by Jesus to represent Him! The "gates of Hades shall not prevail" against Jesus' people, the church (Matt.16:18)
- Through prayer there is a shift in the heavenlies that brings a manifestation on the earth.

Jesus gave even more authority to the ones He sent – v.19

- Demonic beings were 'under their feet'
- Jesus gave them authority "over all the power of the enemy" and assured

- them the nothing would "by any means hurt you".
- Jesus affirms this authority in His commission in **Mark 16:17-18**.

v.20 "Rejoice because your names are written in heaven".

- There is a "Book of Life" where names are written (Philippians 4:3) of those who have been "fellow workers"
- Do not look for an 'earthy' reward (2 Corinthians 4:18), what we do in Jesus Name is eternal.
- Paul knew there was a "crown of righteousness" (2 Timothy 4:8) awaiting him.
- > Stay humble even as you see great spiritual victories and the kingdom work going forward!

Summary:

- Jesus is with the ones sent out
- Expect opposition
- Trust Jesus for everything
- Stay focused on the mission
- Stay in the place where you are received
- Heal the sick
- Preach the kingdom of God
- Be accountable.
- Know and walk in the authority that Jesus has given you

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
